The T. L. Hanna Band Program has been recognized as one of the most active and successful programs in the State for well over 25 years. It is very important for everyone to realize that every student has been assigned a place in this year's show. It is imperative that we have 100% attendance at all rehearsals and performances. A great deal of time and money has been invested in the actual drill, and having everyone in his or her place is essential to making it work! We encourage all parents to join our Band Boosters. The sole purpose of this organization is to provide and coordinate services and resources for the benefit of the band students and their families. Band Organizations

Band is a full year course consisting of two distinct semesters or "seasons". The fall semester is primarily considered the marching season while the spring semester is considered the concert season. The following is brief description of the various groups that are associated with the TL Hanna High School Band program:

Marching Band

The TL Hanna High School Marching Band is made up of students from **all** concert bands and percussion ensembles and color guard students. The TLHB performs at all TL Hanna pep rallies, TL Hanna football games, marching contests, and exhibitions. **Membership in the Marching Band is required of all band students.** We do excuse students who participate in TL Hanna Fall Sports such as football, cheer, volleyball, etc. Excused students must stay in good standing with their respective sports program. The marching band has three weeks of band camp prior to the beginning of the school year that is mandatory. The first week is for color guard and percussion students. The second and third week are for the full band. The marching band rehearses Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays afterschool from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM. The marching band also competes on several Saturdays between September and October.

Concert Bands

There are two concert bands at TL Hanna High School. Students are placed into a concert band according to their playing ability, attitude, participation, classification, and instrumentation needs. Students may move from band to band as deemed necessary or appropriate. The concert bands provide for a wide range of playing abilities and time commitment. With team teaching, students will have the opportunity to experience full band, sectionals, and individual attention. The concert bands perform several concerts throughout the year for the school and community, graduation, and the South Carolina Concert Performance Assessment.

Jazz Band

The jazz band will meet in the spring semester at TLHS after school. Membership in the Jazz Band is by audition and approval of the directors only. A student **must** be a member of one of the performing ensembles at TLHS in order to be a member of the Jazz Band. The Jazz Band performs at several events throughout the community and state including the South Carolina Jazz Adjudication Festival.

Percussion Ensemble

All percussion students in the TLHB must participate in the Percussion Ensemble. As opposed to traditional band schedules, our percussion students have their own class they participate in. The percussion ensemble performs alongside the concert bands throughout the year for the school and community, graduation, and the South Carolina Concert Performance Assessment.

Color Guard

One of the most interesting parts of watching a marching band is the color guard. While the patterns of musicians rhythmically marching across the field may hypnotize, some of us may find our gaze broken by the frenetic twirling of brightly colored flags. The color guard has the unique responsibility to interpret the music through visual effects. The color guard is a danced based activity with the use of equipment such as flags, rifles, and sabres. The color guard rehearses with and performs with the marching band at all marching band events.

Winter Guard

The winter guard program is an extension of the color guard program. TLHB offers three separate winter guards based on skill level and audition. There are two groups dedicated to high school students and a third group dedicated to training middle school students. The competition season for the winter guard is between January and April. The winter guard competes in the Carolina Winter Ensemble Association and the Winter Guard International circuits.

Indoor Drumline

The indoor drumline is an extension of the marching band and percussion ensemble. This ensemble is open to all students in the TLHB regardless of instrument and is an auditioned ensemble. The competition season for the indoor drumline is between January and April. The indoor drumline competes in the Carolina Winter Ensemble Association and the Winter Guard International circuits.

TLHB Membership

Membership in the TLHB is open to all students who participate in middle school band or via audition into the high school band. Students are expected to uphold the mission and image of the ideal TL Hanna High School student. Students enrolled in the band class, color guard class, or percussion class must participate in the marching band. Students who participate in TL Hanna Fall Sports and remain in good standing with that sport, are excused from the competitive marching band.

Withdrawal from the Marching Band in the middle of a season is strongly discouraged, as this creates a hardship on the other band members. Persons who do withdraw in mid-season will forfeit all rights and privileges as band members, and will be prohibited from signing up for band in future seasons, unless there is just cause that is acceptable to the band staff or school administration.

The band staff, under the advisement of the school administration, reserves the right to dismiss any person from the band who poses a constant behavior problem, or violates the policies presented in this document or the T.L. Hanna Student Handbook.

The band staff, under the advisement of the school administration, also reserves the right to refuse membership to anyone who fails to meet the minimum standards for musicianship, and/or has an unacceptable school discipline record, and/or has outstanding financial obligations to the band.

Participation Expectations

A yearly band calendar is enclosed for your use in planning your family schedule for the 2020-2021 school year. **Each** band student is important to the success of our many activities. We **must** be able to count on 100% attendance at these rehearsals and performances. If a family emergency occurs unexpectedly, PARENTS, please call the band office or e-mail the directors. Occasionally, there may be family commitments (weddings, graduations, etc.); in which case, we will **try** to be flexible and work with you on an individual basis. This must be discussed in detail well in advance (a month or more!).

Student job commitments and "select sports" are **NOT** reasons for an excused absence from band performances or rehearsal! **Many** band students work and participate in sports and participate successfully in band. We suggest that these students take a copy of the yearly band calendar to his/her employer and/or coach and clear all band performances and rehearsals. Ninety-nine percent of employers are very understanding and are flexible **if** they know of band commitments well in advance, and they understand that band performances are a **required** and vital part of the course work.

Rehearsal Expectations

In band rehearsals, we not only deal with a creative process, but with a great deal more students at one time than do other classroom teachers. Because of this, it is imperative that band students be **organized** and **prepared** for every rehearsal. When an individual is not able to play his/her musical instrument during a rehearsal, it hurts the GROUP as well as the individual. It is important that the student's musical instrument is in good working condition, that (s)he has a pencil to mark music, and that (s)he has important accessories such as reeds, valve oil, sticks, mallets, etc. for **EVERY** rehearsal. It is also obvious that the creative process in which we are involved cannot take place unless there is a quiet, attentive atmosphere in the classroom. Students who do not live up to the high rehearsal expectations of the TLHB will be counseled, and, if necessary, moved to a lower level band or removed from the band program completely.

Rehearsal/Performance Schedule

Every possible date for the school year has been listed on the master rehearsal/performance schedule, published in May of each year. Every attempt has been made to include every date, both mandatory and optional, for those students that participate. Naturally, some concert band dates are not available at this time, but will be published as soon as we have confirmation of those dates. Please keep in mind that all dates and locations are subject to change, but we will always keep you well informed, with the most up-to-date information. Normally, there are two concert band performances that are not included in the early master calendar.

Once school starts, we will begin after-school rehearsals every Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM, throughout the completion of the contest season. After the competition season concludes, the Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday rehearsals will end and there will only be a few concert and parade rehearsals for the remainder of the year.

We strive very hard to make sure that we do not chance any dates in our calendar and that times are approximated as closely as possible. In the event that an event is cancelled, or circumstances result in late arrival times, we do make every reasonable attempt to contact parents through our charms system.

Events are seldom cancelled due to weather concerns. Our general rule is that we meet at the schedule time, regardless of the weather. Afternoon rain will not cancel a performance. In the event that an event is cancelled, we will dismiss the students after parents are contacted.

Summer Band Camp

Marching band summer camp is held three weeks before school starts and runs on a specific schedule.

Week 1: Percussion and Color Guard - 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM

Week 2 and 3: Full Band.

*Monday 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM

*Tuesday 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM

*Wednesday 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM

*Thursday 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM

*Friday 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM

Lunch is provided for the students each day, but students may also bring a lunch or have one delivered to them. **Students are not allowed to leave for lunch.**

Dinner is **NOT** provided. Students will be allowed to leave with parents/guardians for the dinner break, or may have dinner delivered to them.

Saturdays

Our rehearsal and performance schedule is very demanding during marching season. A typical Saturday starts early in the morning with rehearsals and a break for lunch. The band will return to the school at a specific call time, then travel to the competition. Students will be dismissed after we return from the competition, unload, clean, and meet. Students must stay for all wrap-up meetings.

Grading

Grading in band is based upon participation and playing evaluations. Grades for band students are usually higher than the norm which is understandable, since we have the "cream-of-the-crop" of the student body in the band program. Students belong to our program because they "want to", not because they "have to!" Band students receive a grade for each performance attended... i.e. football games, concerts, competitions, rehearsals, etc. Students will receive additional grades based on daily participation, sectionals, playing and written tests, etc. Students must have equipment in good working order and be present at all required rehearsals and performances for their participation grade. If these expectations are not met, the participation grade will be affected.

Release Form

The T. L. Hanna Bands require that our "**medical and permission to travel form**" be on **file, prior to the first performance**. This form pertains to Band events only, and is separate from a similar form the school may have. All members of the band, including any/all auxiliary groups, must have one of these forms completed, signed, and on file. A nurse is always in attendance at all performances as well as the majority of rehearsals.

Fees and Fund-Raising

Without the support of our parents, alumni, and friends, we would not be able to provide the very best for our students. More than 90% of our funding is directly related to our annual Fruit Sale, Band Fees, and Business Sponsorships. All band members are expected to participate in all fund-raising activities.

Band fees cover the cost of Summer Band Camp, uniforms and costumes, band t-shirts, equipment, flags, props, refreshments, staff, music, drill, and so on. All members of the band, including all auxiliary groups, are required to pay band fees. Band fees should be paid in full, prior to the start of the academic school year. It is essential that everyone understand that all fees are committed before the first day of the school year.

BAND FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE

The failure of any band student to meet financial obligations to the band will result in the withholding of the individual's report card and/or transcript, and may be considered grounds to bar the individual from participation in the band in future seasons. However, no student is ever excluded from participation in band due to legitimate financial concerns/hardships. Students who are unable to pay for shoes and band fees may, with approval by the Band Directors, have some of these expenses covered by the Band Booster Club.

Conduct

- Members should treat each other, the band staff and chaperones, with respect at all times.
- Members should maintain a quiet focused rehearsal. Members should not talk when instructions are being given.
- Members should follow all instructions of the band staff and/or chaperones.
- Members are expected to be courteous toward each other, and other people (e.g. spectators, members of other bands, etc.).
- Profanity, vulgarity, and/or obscenity will not be tolerated.

Loud conversations, shouting or other displays of inappropriate behavior in public will not be tolerated.

NEVER say anything negative about Our Band, Our Team, Our School (this includes social media and verbally)

NEVER say anything negative about other bands, teams, schools (this includes social media and verbally)

Rehearsals

- Members should be attentive and refrain from excessive talking.
- Members should remain in their proper position, and remain silent when called to “stand by”

Phones

- The phones in the music offices and in the band room will be made available to members after school hours in order that they may arrange transportation home. Calls must be kept brief.
- Phones are off-limits during school hours unless they obtain permission from the Band Directors
- Phones cannot be used during practices, rehearsals, performances, or football games.
- In accordance with the school policy, cell phones will be taken from students who violate this policy, and the cell phones will be turned into the school office.

Bus

- All students must check in with their chaperone at the door of the bus prior to loading. Students will not be allowed on the bus unless they are fully and appropriately dressed including shoes and socks. All backpacks and carry on items may be searched.
- All riders must remain seated when the bus is in motion.
- All riders must keep all appendages inside of the bus, at all times.
- Audio-Video equipment is prohibited on the bus, unless it is used with a personal listening device (i.e. headphones).
- Students must remain on the bus until instructed to get off by a chaperone or Band Director
- No one is allowed on the bus unless an adult chaperone, or the bus driver, is present.
- Inappropriate physical or verbal contact of a hostile or an intimate nature between students will not be tolerated.
- Members are not allowed to switch buses for any reason.
- Students must keep all conversations low in volume. Students who are heard over the bus will be moved to an assigned seat.
- No opened bottles or drinks of any kind will be allowed on the buses. All back-packs and carry on items can be searched and checked by chaperones prior to boarding.
- All students must ride to and from every event on the District V Buses. Students may ride home with a parent/guardian if contacted and worked out in advance.

Overnight Trips and Hotel Protocol:

- Parents and students will be responsible for paying for any incurred charges, including lost room keys.
- Rooms are to be locked at all times.
- No one of the opposite sex in your room, unless accompanied by a chaperone.

- No one except the Hanna chaperones or students are allowed in your room.
- Instruments may not be played in hotel rooms.
- No one is to leave hotel grounds alone or without permission. Any students found leaving the premises without permission will be dealt with severely.
- All students and adults must realize that any personal desires or preferences may have to be put aside for the duration of the trip in order to facilitate large group control and management.
- All students must have some type of official picture ID; either a driver's license, a DMV identification card or a similar official photo ID

Transportation

- Band members are expected to arrange their own transportation to and from school for all rehearsals and performances. Members are encouraged to have their rides pick them up promptly, as the band room area must be chaperoned until all band members have secured a ride home.
- In keeping with the policy of Anderson School District V, all band members must travel to and from all events and/or band trips, WITH THE BAND, on District V vehicles. Students may ride home with a parent/guardian if contacted and worked out in advance.
- In extreme circumstances, the Sheriffs office will be called for students who do not have a ride home.

Lockers

- Band members are issued a locker at the beginning of the season. Students must provide their own lock for the locker. Locks left on lockers at the end of the school year may be cut off and will not be reimbursed.
- These lockers are for storing instruments when not in use, and for safeguarding personal belongings during rehearsals and performances.
- The band will not be held responsible for any items stolen from the band facility at any time. Members are encouraged not to store valuable items in these lockers.

Stands

- Band members, staff, and chaperones must sit as a group in the stands. All other persons are prohibited from sitting in the band section.
- Band members must sit in their respective section, and may not move from that section while the band is in the stands.
- Members may not play their instruments except when instructed to do so by a staff member or the drum major. Individual playing is not allowed.
- Members must report to the stands immediately after the halftime performance. Drinks are provided for all band students during the third quarter.
- Non-band members, including parents, may not bring food nor drinks to the members in the stands.

Band Room Facilities

- Personal items must be removed from the band room following each class or rehearsal. These items may be kept in the individual lockers.
- Food, drink, and/or gum are not allowed on the carpeted areas.
- All equipment, including stands and chairs, must be returned to their respective positions after each use.
- Any defacing or vandalism of the band facility is subject to penalties set forth in the T.L. Hanna Student Handbook.
- No students, other than the band members, are allowed in the band facility without permission and/or a pass from the Band Director.

Band Equipment

- Band members are expected to have the proper equipment (i.e. instrument, reed, mouthpieces, drumsticks, flags, etc.) at every rehearsal and performance. It is the responsibility of the individual to keep his/her equipment in proper, working order.
- Instruments that are the property of the school may be checked out and used by registered band members. These instruments must be signed out by the user, who is responsible for the instrument as outlined in their user contract for school instruments and uniforms. A copy of this contract must be kept on file by the band vice-president, and the user must also be registered in the band office computer. Students who are not in good standing with the band in regard to fees, unexcused absences will forfeit any rights to use school equipment.
- Flutes, soprano clarinets, all saxophones, trumpets, and trombones are subject to a \$25 per semester rental fee. Directors may wave this fee under certain circumstances. Students with poor grades, unpaid band fees, or unexcused absences will not be allowed to use school equipment or instruments.
- School instruments must be treated with reasonable care, or the user will forfeit the privilege of using school instruments. He/she will also be charged for any and all repairs or replacements of the instrument. This determination shall be at the sole discretion of the Band Director.
- All instruments must be marked with the user's name on the side of the case.
- No member should ever use another person's equipment.
- Percussionists alone are permitted to use the percussion equipment.
- Color guard members alone are permitted to use color guard equipment.

Music

- All band members are expected to keep up with, and take care of all music that is issued to them. Music should never be marked with anything other than a **pencil**. Lost music will be the responsibility of the student.
- All matters related to music should be addressed to the band secretaries, or to the appropriate section leader. They are the only personnel authorized to use the music files and/or photocopy machine at any time.
- Students are financially responsible for any/all school equipment that is not returned when requested, and/or for any/all school equipment that is returned damaged

beyond what is considered normal wear and tear. This determination shall be at the sole discretion of the Band Director.

Dress

Band members are expected to dress appropriately for all performances. Any inappropriate dress will result in exclusion from the performance, and will count as an unexcused absence. There are two types of performances: Uniformed and events and Non-Uniformed events. The band staff reserves the right to establish all regulations in regard to proper dress.

Chaperones

One of the most important jobs in the band program is taking care of our students. Chaperones/volunteers are needed for all band events, including band rehearsals, football games, trips, competitions, and other performances and events. There are various chaperone functions required at each band event, depending on the type of event, and whether travel is involved. All chaperones that are around students must pass a SLED background check.

In accordance with District V Policy, students participating in field or school excursions will be under the direct supervision of District employees at all times. There will be at least one district employee in each vehicle transporting students. The bus driver will not be considered as that district employee, unless that bus driver is an administrator, teacher, coach, counselor, or full-time district supervisor. **In accordance with SC State law, T.L. Hanna Band Chaperones who travel with the band must undergo the same SLED background check that is required of all Anderson District Five employees. They must also have a medical release form on file with the Band Director. Parents who wish to chaperone must pay the \$25 fee for a background check. This fee is payable to Anderson District V.**

General Responsibilities

- Supervise the band room area, before and after all performances
- Walk with the band to and from the football stadium for performances
- Carry jackets, coats, and student supplies
- Rope off the bleacher areas for band seating
- Check uniforms, shoes, gloves, and assist students with uniforms and equipment
- Supervise stand behavior at football games and competitions
- Accompany any student who needs medical attention
- Make sure that students are aware of rules and procedures and that they follow them. If any student does not comply when asked to do or not do something, the chaperone should report this to the nearest District Five Employee who will handle the matter or contact the Band Director if necessary

Bus/Trip Chaperone Duties

- Check buses carefully at every stop
- Maintain order during rest stops, at eating establishments, when crossing heavy traffic areas, etc.
- Insure that no one other than band students/personnel/chaperones get on the bus
- Insure that students follow bus procedures/behavior policies stated in this handbook
- Report any student problems to the nearest District Five employee. Chaperons may, and certainly should, ask any band member to refrain from inappropriate behavior, but they do not have the legal authority to discipline any child other than their own. District employees and the Band Directors will deal with any problems of this nature. (You will find that most students will comply with adult requests unless they are embarrassed in front of their peers or tempers have short-circuited their judgement for the moment.)
- Remain with the group at all times... during warm-up, loading and unloading, etc.
- Do not leave the group... chaperones may not leave the group to shop, sight-see etc while on trips
- Sit in different areas of the bus to allow for proper supervision of all students
- Make sure that the bus is left clean after a trip... all trash is picked up and no clothes or personal items are left on the bus.
- Help students who may not be able to secure a ride home after a trip

Trip Chaperones

On overnight trips, chaperones are assigned student rooms to monitor and supervise. This includes inspection of rooms for broken and damaged articles, the care and security of the students in these rooms, maintaining order, enforcing curfews, and seeing that students are in the right place at the right time with regard to schedules. Each chaperone will be required to pay for their trip, at the rate designated by the Band Directors. If you wish to be considered for a trip chaperone position, you will need to complete the necessary paperwork, which is distributed late in the fall of each year. Only those parents who have chaperoned previously are eligible to apply for overnight trips. This rule will be waived for parents who need to travel with their child for medical reasons:

District Five Employees
Chaperones who know the students
Previous involvement with Booster Club activities
Medical skills (Nurse)
Couples who can go together

The Band Directors will make the selections, and will notify those involved, prior to the trip dates.

Chaperone selection is the sole discretion of the Band Director

Band-Aides

The TLHB Band-Aides is the parent support group for all of the Band programs at T. L. Hanna High School. Membership is open to any individual with a desire to promote the welfare of the program and provide opportunities for the students to engage in positive activities in our school and our community, as well as the other places to which they travel.

Parental support is essential in order for the Band to maintain the level of excellence it has achieved in the past. Any individual who wants to be a Band Booster may do so. Our Band depends on the support of parents, grandparents, friends and family, sharing their talents and time, to provide positive opportunities for our students. The fundraising, marching, concert, and color guard competitions, as well as all other activities, require the time and dedication of Band parents and students to be successful. Parents are needed to serve on committees, work at fundraisers, assemble, disassemble, and move equipment, chaperone, make phone calls, serve snacks and provide skills such as accounting, sewing, cooking, and computer work. Become involved in whatever way you can. Being a Booster is hard work, but the rewards are far greater than the labor that goes into it!

We ask that every parent make an effort to become involved in some way, so that the Band program will continue to grow and flourish. The Band program not only develops the music skills that will give your child years of pleasure in the future, but it helps them acquire the focus and poise needed to perform in front of a group. It affords them the opportunity to work in a large group setting that requires patience, concentration, and cooperation. They see first-hand what happens to the group's goals when some members are late or unprepared. And they see what **can** be accomplished when everyone pulls together to achieve the higher common goal of the group versus the individual goals and ambitions of one member. This knowledge will serve them well in their adult years! What better way to show your child you care about the things that are important to him or her than to become involved in the program. Meetings are usually on the **2nd Tuesday** evening of each month at **7:15 PM**, in the T.L.H. **Band Room**. We hope to see you there.
